My home has been uninhabitable for the past month because my private well is dry and keeps burning out my pumps!

My wife and small child are forced to shower at a relative's home. Although my father-in-law Nelson Mather paid good money for a leased surface water right from Emigration Improvement District Manager Fred Smolka, the creek is now completely dry in front of our house!!!

Please explain to me how EID has asked you to approve the commercial wells of Emigration Oaks under "a44045" but still asked you to approve a permanent change application "a44046" (57-10711) for my leased surface water right (point-of-diversion Nr. 2), when EID itself already told you THAT BIG WELLS IN EMIGRATION CANYON WOULD DRY UP THE STREAM!!!

EID Attorney Kinghorn:

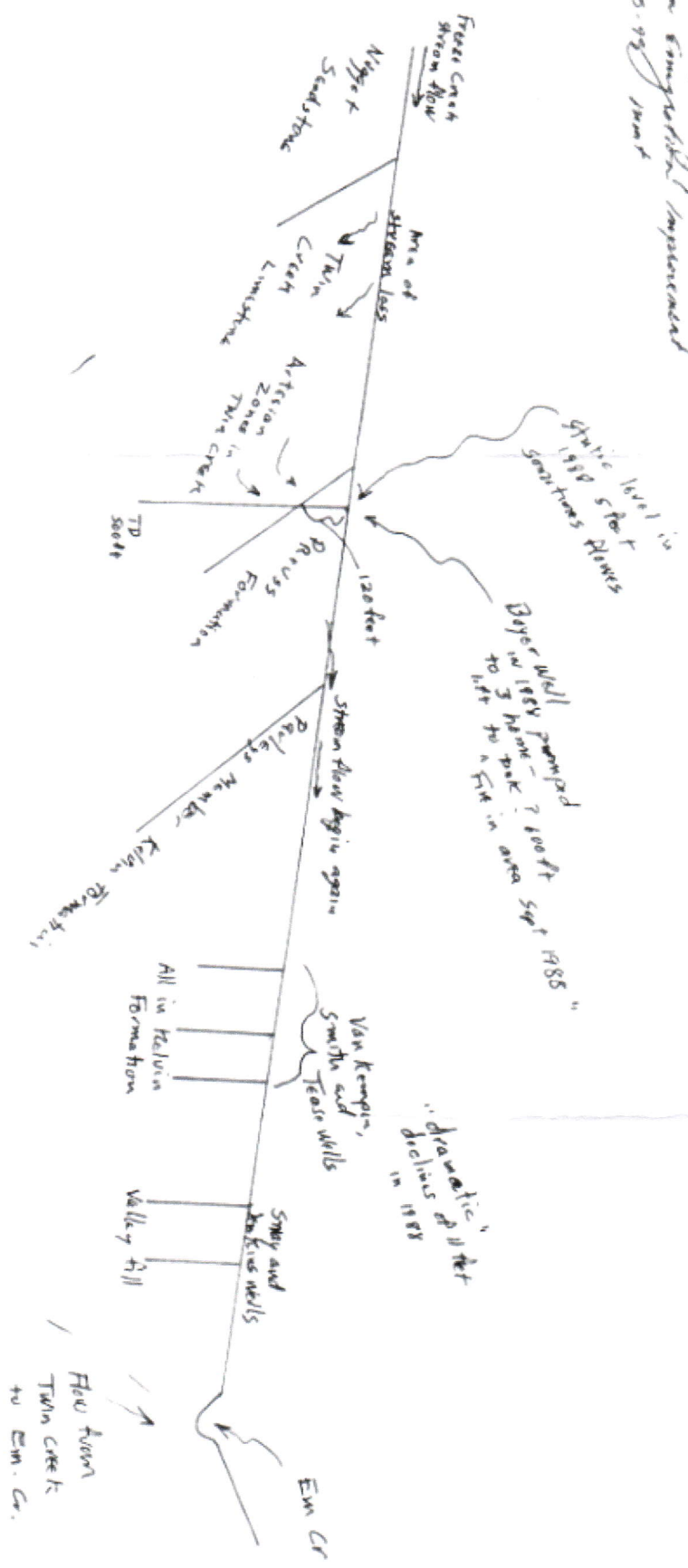
[09:03]: "Is that also the case if the septic tank use were in the Brigham Fork drainage to the east?"
