RE: Request for written confirmation and documentation

Dear Mr. Riley:

The Emigration Improvement District would like to thank you for your help in the past and, naturally, makes further requests herein.

Would you please verify the amount of water, in acre feet and also gallons, that The Boyer Company currently holds deed to in the Emigration Canyon Drainage.

We believe The Boyer Company purchased part of WRNUM 57-69 and that Mt. Olivet Cemetery still owns the majority of that right. If this is accurate would you please verify that information. Specifically, how much of the right did The Boyer Company purchase and how much of the right did Mt. Olivet retain?

It is our understanding that the entire water right is sufficient to irrigate 7.27 acres (seven point two seven) yet we feel that the Emigration Oaks subdivision is exceeding this irrigation amount substantially. We wish to enlist your help in determining the legal irrigation permissible under The Boyer Company/Freeze Creek Water Company water right.

Using 0.45 acre feet of water as a standard for indoor use, how many square feet will the remaining 0.05 acre feet allotted each home in Emigration Oaks irrigate?

The Environmental Health Division has informed us that the State Health Department requires 0.45 acre feet of water for indoor use per dwelling, which is also the State Engineer's requirement. Also the State Health Department requires, on the average, 0.45 acre feet of water for outdoor irrigation. If this is the case, how many acre feet would be required for use by 155 homes (one hundred fifty five)?
