In turn, all papers filed by the opposing party must be served on you so that you may respond.

This court will permit documents to be filed by email by attaching a searchable PDF file of no more than 25 MB. Unless the court orders otherwise, the filing of documents and briefs is timely if the email is received before midnight on the last day for filing.
